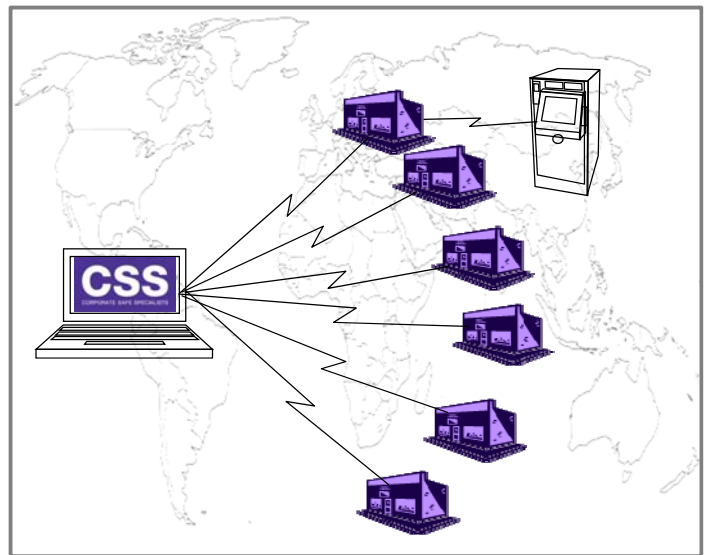

ACCS Evolution Continues with Enhanced Remote Management Capability

CSS continues to expand the capabilities of our Advanced Cash Control System (ACCS) product line to meet the needs of the marketplace. One of the areas we put a significant amount of focus on is our ability to support our customers during installation, setup and ongoing maintenance of their cash management systems.

In the latest release of the ACCS software we have enhanced our remote management capability. Simply put, remote access provides two way communication between any ACCS unit and our central support groups. This allows us to perform a number of activities without having to be physically on-site where the unit is located. Following are a few of the activities we can handle remotely:

Software updates: Our engineering and IT departments can provide updates to the ACCS application software or operating system. They can also provide updates to the unit's bill validators or device drivers (e.g. fingerprint reader, swipe-card reader, printers.)



Setup Control – We can provide remote support of setup activities should a question arise as to how to configure a unique condition.

Trouble Shooting – Allows virtual support assistance from specialists located at central locations.

Data Retrieval or Upload – Provides the ability to directly download information from the ACCS software such as transaction data or log information from validator software.

The enhanced ACCS remote management capability provides a number of benefits to our customers. Rollout of system upgrades and enhancements are accelerated, while greatly reducing the effort of both CSS and customer staff. In addition, customers are able to quickly access CSS engineering and IT expertise for installation and service support.

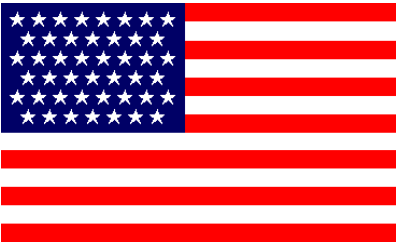

**July 4, 2010 Marks
50th Anniversary of
50-Star U.S. Flag**



The original thirteen colonies are represented by the alternating red and white stripes of the U.S. flag.

Vermont and Kentucky were briefly represented by two additional stripes that appeared on the 15-star flag from May 1, 1795 to April 13, 1818. This is the only flag to feature more than thirteen stripes and was heralded in Francis Scott Key's Star-Spangled Banner.

On July 4, 1960, the American flag was officially changed to the 13-stripe and 50-star design when Hawaii became the fiftieth state. This particular design has flown for almost 50 years. Eleven U.S. Presidents have served under this 50-star flag.

Contrary to popular belief, the colors red, white, and blue did not have meanings for The Stars and Stripes when it was adopted in 1777.

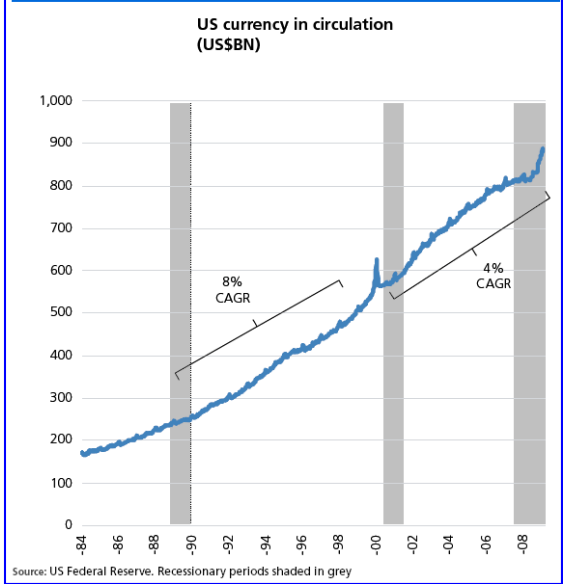

Taking a Pulse on Cash Usage

The use of cash is something CSS keeps a close eye on. As reported in a recent study by Celent the amount of cash in circulation continues to grow.

Lest there be any thought about cash going away, use of cash in the US continues to increase despite the rapid growth in the use of electronic payments. The Federal Reserve reports the dollar amount of currency in circulation worldwide has grown 88% in the past 10 years to US\$770 billion in 2007 and US\$889 billion in late 2008. Meanwhile, the amount of cash ordered and deposited through Federal Reserve Banks has increased 75%, to over 27 billion bank notes annually. Use of cash within the US remains strong, with no indication of a "cashless society" any time soon.
